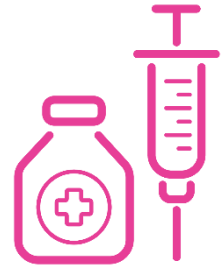


Vaccinations

MenB vaccine for young people

Until March 2027, the MenB vaccine is now also offered to some young people. Eligibility depends on when they were born and if they are starting further education soon. Find out more about the MenB vaccine on the [NHS website](#).

First doses can be booked until 30 December 2026 with last appointments on 31 December 2026. Second doses can be booked until 30 March 2027 with last appointments on 31 March 2027.
